## CAMROSE AREA MASONS CELEBRATE 80TH ANNIVERSARY

The 80th Anniversary of Camrose Lodge No. 37 was celebrated at the regular meeting Thursday, November 12 and by a banquet and dance in the Hall on Saturday, November 14.

At the lodge meeting the Worshipful Master, W.Bro. Grattidge, had the minutes of the first meeting held on December 12, 1907, read. The minutes named the officers of the new Lodge and six candidates for initiation.

W.Bro. Stan Hambly, one of the senior Past Masters in the Lodge outlined some of the highlights in the 80 years of Lodge history. The Lodge helped in the formation of Lodges in Killam, Daysland, and Hardisty in 1909. The Lodge had occupied various buildings until 1968 when the Lodge purchased the building which it now occupies. In 1976, Melrose Lodge No. 62 in Bawlf amalgamated with Camrose Lodge, adding 33 members. There have been 460 members initiated into the Camrose Lodge during the 80 years.

Bro. H. Anderson was presented with a 25 year pin and certificate by R.W.Bro. K. Mingo. W.Bro. J. Barr was presented with his Past Master's certificate by R.W. Bro. Don Millar. W.Bro. D. Peterson presented 80th Anniversary coins to the Grand Lodge Officers, R.W.Bro. Miller and R.W. Bro. Mingo. W.Bro. W. French led the rededication ceremony in a very impressive manner.

Including wives, widows, and guests there were more than 100 in attendance at the banquet. With the dance following, it was a very enjoyable evening and a fitting climax to the 80th Anniversary Celebration of the Lodge.

## ANSWER TO JANUARY QUESTION OF THE MONTH

The English word 'Lewis' is a term belonging to operative Masonry, and signifies an iron cramp, which is inserted in a cavity prepared for the purpose in a large stone, so as to give attachment to a pulley and hook, whereby a stone may be conveniently raised and deposited in its proper position.

Extending the symbolic allusion further, the son of a Mason in England is called a 'Lewis', because it is his duty to support the sinking powers and aid the failing strength of his father or as has been expressed "To bear the burden and heat of the

day, that his parents may rest in their old age, thus rendering the evening of their lives peaceful and happy."

In Speculative Masonry in Britain, a Lewis is the initiated son of a Freemason whether he was born after or before his father became a Mason. The only privilege of a Lewis is to claim to be the senior of the candidates at his initiation ceremony. Under the Grand Lodge of Scotland a Lewis can be initiated at the age of 18 but this privilege does not routinely exist elsewhere.

## FREEMASONRY AND CHRISTIANITY, ARE THEY COMPATIBLE?

A paper with the above title was presented as "A Contribution to Discussion" to the General Synod of the Church of England on July 13th 1987. The paper was developed by a team consisting of two members of the clergy who were Freemasons, three additional clergyman, and two women, one of whom chaired the Committee.

The committee condemned various areas of Freemasonry on the grounds it is religious but not Christian. Specifically identified were certain parts of the Royal Arch ritual.

The short (30 minute) debate at the Synod was generally favourable to Freemasonry although the arguements were based on many misconceptions caused by inadequate information and lack of knowledge

The Synod voted on a resolution endorsing the report and the resolution was passed by the large majority. The report is now "commended for discus-

sion by the Church" (which includes many Masons).

The United Grand Lodge of England has published a commentary on the events and challenges the issues raised on a 'paragraph by paragraph' approach.

The key part of the U.G.L. commentary is that Christian Freemasons know and accept that Freemasonry is not heretical and that the Royal Arch is not blasphemous.

The commentary stresses that requests for responses should be directed through the Grand Secretary.

## LODGE NOTICES

The members of the Bulletin Committee together with Grand Lodge Officers have the opportunity to see all the Lodge notices. This certainly allows for comparison of their appearance, their content, their enhancements and their problems. It was decided that it would be appropriate to recognize some of the best notices and to comment generally on them.

The first thing that is obvious is that notices vary from typeset to hand duplicated through computer setup to "fill in the blanks by hand". They can contain information that varies from the interesting to the absolute minimum requir

ement.

Some do not even have what is essential for an official document to its members.

For those lodges with the best notices there has obviously been effort put into their production by many brethren through suggestions and help.

The absolute requirement of every summons is that it must have the Lodge Seal and be in a cover approved by the Grand Master (Const. 525 (3)). It should certainly contain information on the Secretary, the W.M. the Grand Master and his Senior Officers and the activities expected at the meeting. There is specified information required on applicants and candidates, as well as on Notices of Motion.

Surely this is not all, for this is sometimes the only form of communication between the Lodge and its membership.

As an example, a lodge notice is published on the opposite page which was voted by the Bulletin Committee, as the best typeset notice published in the Jurisdiction. It is appealing to the eye; it contains all essential information on an ongoing basis together with personal touches, and it communicates through a regular Master's Message. It also has been very well thought out with its columns having all the Past Masters' names contained on the shafts. It is printed in blue on a pale (It has been reduced in size for cream paper. reproduction here). In future issues of the Bulletin it is hoped to identify other excellent notices printed in different styles or methods. Congratulations to the brethren of Empire Lodge No. 63.


