## M.W. Bro. D.R. (Don) Millar Grand Master 1990/91

M.W. Bro. Donald Ryan Millar was born in Edmonton on November 20th, 1928. He was educated in the public schools of the capital city.

The three symbolic degrees of Freemasonry were conferred on Bro. Don Millar in Temple Lodge No. 167 in 1955 and he occupied the Chair of King Solomon in that Lodge in 1966.

The fourth to thirty-second degrees of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite of Freemasonry were conferred on Illustrious Brother Don Millar in The Edmonton Valley in

1958/59. He served as Thrice Puissant Grand Master of the Edmonton Lodge of Perfection 1978/79 and Most Wise Sovereign of Mizpah Chapter of Rose Croix 1969/70. He was Coronetted an Honorary Inspector General, 33° Alberta Consistory 1984. Don was a made member of the Royal Order of Scotland in 1986.

Mendicant D.R. Millar crossed the hot sands of the desert in 1970 to seek succour under the protective dome of the Al Azhar Shrine Temple. In 1978 he was elected Captain of the Edmonton Shrine Club Arab Patrol. Noble Don Millar was a Founding & Charter Member of Al Shamal Temple AAOONMS in 1985 and served as Chaplain in 1987. As Grand Master, he was invited to attend the Imperial Council Sessions in Chicago.

As a Grand Lodge Officer, M.W. Bro. Don Millar was elected Deputy Grand Master of District No. 3 1972/73, Junior Grand Warden 1987, and followed the "cursus honorarium" to Grand Master 1990/91. Don served on the Board of General Purposes, on the Finance Committee, and on the Jurisprudence Committee. Since 1973 he has been the Grand Representative near the G.L.A. for the Grand Lodge of Nevada.

As a Grand Lodge Officer, M.W. Bro. Don has visited the Grand Lodge of British Columbia, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, and Ontario.

As an astute business man and entrepreneur, Don founded Spartan Press Ltd. in 1972 and has managed to retain ownership in a leveraged buy-out economy.

As an actively participating communicant in the Anglican Church, Don served on the General Synod of Canada and as a Licensed Lay reader, Warden, Treasurer, and Synod representative for Holy Trinity Anglican Church in Edmonton. He is also involved in the management of Trinity Hall Senior citizens Residence.

Evelyn is Don's lovely chatelaine and their progeny consist of three sons, one daughter, five grandsons and one granddaughter.

## Editor's Summary of Intent of Motions Adopted 1990 Communication

- The Masonic Charitable Foundation of Alberta was established.
- An Audit Committee was created.
- The duties of the Deputy Grand Master and the Grand Wardens were amended.
- The office of Grand Registrar was changed from an elected to an appointed position, duties and responsibilities were spelt out.
- The qualifications for nomination for election to D.D.G.M. were amended.
- Confirmation of rank of Past D.D.G.M. made compulsory.
- Number of votes cast by a Past Master in election of D.D.G.M. restricted.
- Terms of reference for Board of General Purposes amended.
- Terms of reference of Finance Committee revised.
- Terms of reference for Jurisprudence Committee revised.
- Fraternal Relations committee was empowered to participate in discussion relative to recognition of Regular Prince Hall Grand Lodges.
- Annual adjustment in Per Capita Fee to reflect rate-of-inflation factor instituted.
- Aprons of 75-year-old Lodges may now be bound with silver metallic braid.
- Time lapse permitted an investigating committee on petition for initiation clarified.
- "All collections of monies made in a Lodge while tyled must be used for no other purpose than that of Benevolence."
- Once again several notices of motion were withheld because they were "irregular" in the considered opinion of the Jurisprudence Committee.

## Happy New Year!

The Jewish New Year occurs on Rosh Hashanah, September 20/21, 1990 (5751 Lunar Calendar). Ten High Holy Days begin with this Day of Judgment. Yahweh's omnipotence and glory is acknowledged and Jews pray that He will be merciful to them even though they may be undeserving and forgive them their sinfulness and wickedness.

Symbolic of submission to Yahweh's will, and symbolic of the ram that was sacrificed in the place of Abraham's son Isaac, the blowing of a curved shofar is a vital part of the holiday. Symbolic of the realization of Yahweh's supremacy, the Jew genuflects in the synagogue. At the festive meal, a piece of bread is dipped into honey as a token of the sweet year it is hoped will come. The sending of greeting cards is now fairly widespread.

After ten days of repentance dawns the most solemn day in the Jewish year, Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement. On this day there is to be no eating, no drinking, no wearing of leather shoes, no sexual intercourse and no anointing (that is, no bathing, no showering, no makeup, no hair spray, etc. Jews are to spend almost all of their waking hours in prayer; they are to serve Yahweh not as men but as angels, by putting aside as many human endeavours as possible.

The essence of the day is stated clearly in Leviticus 16:30: "For on this day shall atonement be made to you, to cleanse you; from all your sins shall ye be clean before the Lord." And so it is a day of purification for those who confess their guilt and iniquity. On the eve of the day there

is usually a family feast part of which is the asking of forgiveness of others.

The importance and significance of these holy days to our Masonic brethren who are Jews can scarcely be overestimated. Celebrate with them!
