Most Worshipful Brother J.R. Crawford Grand Master — 1992-1993

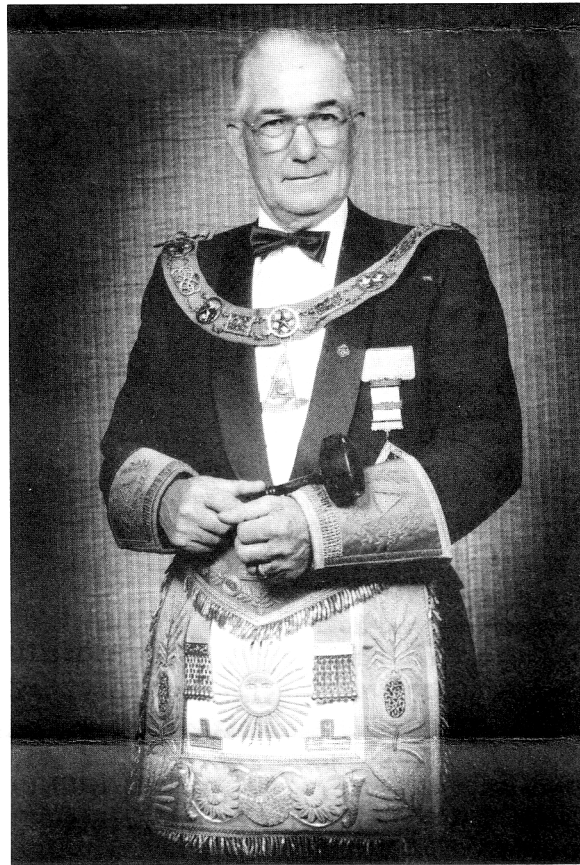

He was initiated into Masonry in Forestburg Lodge No. 128 in 1963, and became Worshipful Master in 1976 and DDGM of District No. 5 in 1982/83. He is a Past Principal of Bethel Chapter No. 36 R.A.M.; Past District Superintendent of District No. 5 and Past Grand First Principal, R.A.M. of Alberta. He is a member of Edmonton Preceptory No. 46; a member of Taylor Conclave No. 5, Red Cross of Constantine; member of Zohar Council of the Cryptic Rite and a member of Al Azhar Temple AAONMS.

M.W.Bro. Crawford received his education in Forestburg. Having been farm raised, he was destined to pursue agricultural endeavours throughout his life in the production of grain and livestock and is still working in these areas. Community involvements include the United Church Board, the Agricultural Society, the Board of Education, the Adult Committee of the 4-H Beef Club and three consecutive terms on the County Council.

M.W.Bro. Crawford is married to Irene and has two daughters, who have made him a happy grandfather of five grandchildren.

Motions Passed At Grand Lodge 1992

Regulation, Sect 3.15 (a) be added to the existing Section, which will allow for the establishment of a Masonic Board of Relief where four or more Lodges are in an area. The amendment gives the structure of such a Board.

Regulation, Sect 1.04.07.02 be added which gives an annual assessment to the Board of Benevolence to assist in building up a depleting fund.

The 100th Grand Lodge Communication, in the year 2005, will be in Medicine Hat, as was the first Grand Lodge.

The 90th Grand Lodge Communication will be held in Red Deer in 1995.

Regulation Sect.4.03.06 be added to allow for the presentation of a Tylers' Long Service Jewel.

Regulation 1.04.08.03 be corrected, so that the date reads March 15.

Regulation 4.05 be added which will allow for a Masonic Medal of Merit, which can be awarded to Master Masons who have demonstrated exemplary Masonic lives but who have not passed through the chairs.

Regulation 3.10.01.03 be added which will allow a Master to issue a marked demit.

Answer To May's Question

Even the simplest of questions can be difficult when reading the Constitution carefully as **Article 6, Composition of Grand Lodge** states quite clearly: "Grand Lodge shall consist of its Grand Officers, Past Grand Masters, Past Grand Officers, Past Masters of Constituent Lodges, and the Constituent Lodges as represented by the Worshipful Master, Senior Warden and Junior Warden and all Master Masons who have an elected or appointed office thereof.

Article 8.02 states "Where a Master Mason is a member of Grand Lodge, he is eligible for appointment as Grand Chaplain, Grand Organist, or for election as Grand Tyler, with all rights and privileges attached thereto except the right to vote, unless otherwise qualified."

Therefore it appears that to be appointed to any of these offices one must now be an elected or appointed officer of a Constituent lodge.

Canadian Cancer Society Volunteer Driver Program

The Calgary Masonic Board of Relief has undertaken to assist the Canadian Cancer Society by locating Masons, from within the Craft, to participate in its Volunteer Driver Program. The Society has experienced a greatly increased requirement this year for volunteer drivers. Through its representatives in Calgary area Lodges, the Board has been successful during the month of April '92 in filling the need for 25 volunteers, mostly from retired or semi-retired Masons.

We are now expanding our search outside Calgary to the southern Alberta area covered by the Calgary Unit of the Society.

Cancer Can Be Beaten — Volunteer Drivers Needed

The Canadian Cancer Society is a national, community-based organization of volunteers whose mission is the eradication of cancer and the enhancement of the quality of life of people living with cancer. The Volunteer Driver Program provides needed transportation to and from the Tom Baker Cancer Centre at Foothills Hospital and other medical facilities.

The Calgary Unit of the Society is responsible for most of southern Alberta and needs volunteer drivers from the following towns and cities in its area where Masonic Lodges are located:

The Month Of September

The month of September, the first month of the autumn season, is the ninth month of the year.
