Myron Lusk, Grand Master The Grand Lodge Of Alberta: 1993 - 1994

Myron Lusk was born Myron Luchkovich in Edmonton on November 13, 1929, and took his schooling in the same city. He played on many championship football teams, won both boxing and wrestling championships of City High School Tournaments and played hockey in the Edmonton Maple Leaf Organization. He left home in 1947 at age 17 to work in Vancouver and returned to Edmonton in 1948.

On March 17, 1951, he married Audrey Atkinson and they have been blessed with 5 children — Brenda Mae, Gregory William, Desmond John, Cynthia Katherine and Jack Edward. At this writing, Myron and Audrey boast of 9 grandchildren. They reside at 8910 - 162 Street and at their summer cottage on Big Island, Jackfish Lake.

Myron has served as President of the Sherwood Community League and President of the Sherwood Home and School Association, and has coached both hockey and baseball teams for the Sherwood and Meadowlark Park Community Leagues. He also played drums with dance bands for many years. Myron is a member of Central United Church, where he sings in the choir.

Myron and Audrey are employed as Manufacturers' Agents, operating as Myron Lusk Sales Ltd. Myron served as President of the Alberta Fashion Market (A.F.M.) for many years and was a founding member of the Canadian Association of Wholesale Salesmen (C.A.W.S.).

His hobbies are racquetball, windsurfing and writing. He also delights in collecting and growing Alberta wild



flowers in their lake cottage flower garden.

Myron was initiated, passed and raised in Evergreen Lodge No. 166, G.R.A. in 1966 and was its Worshipful Master in 1973/74. He is an affiliated Past Master of Ivanhoe Lodge No. 142 and a Charter Member of Fiat Lux Lodge of Research No. 1980.

He was District No. 12 Research and Education Chairman from 1970 to 1973 and an elected Member of the Board of General Purposes Committee for 1977/78, 1979/80 and 1984/85.

He was elected Grand Registrar for 1981/82 and District Deputy Grand Master of District No. 12 for 1983/84.

Myron was elected Junior Grand Warden for 1990/91 and served as Chairman of the Masonic Renewal Committee for 1991/93 and also as a member of the Masonic Renewal Committee of North America from 1991 to 1993.

He was installed as Grand Master on June 12, 1993.

Myron has been a regular participant at Masonic Spring Workshops as a Theme Speaker and in conducting Schools of Instruction and demonstrations.

In concordant bodies, he was Thrice Puissant Grand Master, Edmonton Lodge of Perfection in 1977/78; Most Wise Sovereign, Mizpah Chapter Rose Croix in 1983/84; and Coroneted 33rd Degree, Honorary Inspector General, A & A.S.R. in 1984.

He was inducted as a Member of the Royal Order of Scotland in 1988 and is a member of North Star Chapter No. 2 R.A.M.; Zohar Council No. 4, Cryptic Rite; and Edmonton Preceptory No. 46, Knights Templar.

Motions Approved At Grand Lodge Affecting The Constitution And Regulations

There were no Notices of Motion to Amend the Constitution but the following amendments to the Regulations, made by the Board of General purposes, were ratified by Grand Lodge:

1. Regulation Section 1.01.03 be suspended for the year 1995, and the Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge of Alberta shall commence not earlier than 8:00 a.m. on the first Friday of the month of June in 1995.
2. Regulation Section 1.02.01 of Constitution and Regulations be amended to read: "Nominations for any elective office shall be made by a member of Grand Lodge on the prescribed form which must be in the hands of the Grand Lodge office not later than 12:00 o'clock noon on the last working day of February."
3. Regulation Section 1.07.03.05 of Constitution and Regulations, be amended to read: "Three elected members shall constitute a quorum."

Answer to the Question of the Month for June

What is a paradigm and how does it apply to Masonry?

This would be an easy answer for all those who attended the Masonic Spring Workshop in April, for the Speaker, Dudley Davis and a video explained it fully. Ask someone who attended to share the paper with you. In short, a paradigm is a conceptual framework inside which theories are constructed. It can be extremely destructive if the framework is so rigid that external events taking place are not taken into account. The classic example was for the Swiss to consider the electronic watch as a momentary irritation and not a thing to be seriously considered in their ongoing planning. The result was the almost complete loss of the watch industry to other nations.
